#### Council election results

The three members will each be serving a second three-year term on Council, beginning April 25, 2018 and ending at the Council meeting in April 2021.

#### When is someone a "patient"?

The Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care is conducting a consultation about three new Regulations to be made under the <u>Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991</u> that will:

- establish criteria for the purpose of defining who is a patient, in the context of sexual abuse;
- expand the information that each health regulatory College is required to post about members of the profession on their public register; and
- identify prescribed offences for which College Discipline Committee panels would be required to revoke the certificate of registration of members found guilty of professional misconduct under clause 51(1)(a) of the Health Professions Procedural Code, which is Schedule 2 of the Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991.

#### Consent & capacity knowledge assessment – input needed

The Consent & Capacity Working Group of the Federation of Health Regulatory Colleges of Ontario is assessing the current consent and capacity knowledge of all regulated health professionals. The survey results will help to determine the feasibility of creating educational materials to improve Members' understanding of their obligations for obtaining consent and for assessing capacity in their respective practice settings.

Members are asked to complete the five – 10 minute <u>survey</u> by no later than April 15. Responses are anonymous and will only be used in aggregate format.

#### Office of the Fairness Commissioner assessment

Similar to regulated health professionals in Ontario, the College is also governed by legislation and organizations that define its work. We are in the midst of an assessment of our registration practices, conducted by the *Office of the Fairness Commissioner* (OFC), which takes place either as a full or partial assessment every three years. The OFC is an agency of the Ontario government with the mandate to ensure that the registration practices of Ontario's regulated professions and trades are transparent, objective, impartial, and fair. This year's full assessment is reviewing all of the specific and general duties described in the *Fair Access to Regulated* 

<u>Professions and Compulsory Trades Act, 2006</u> and the <u>Regulated Health Professions Act, 1991</u> - collectively known as fair access legislation. The final report will identify areas where we are doing well and where further improvement is needed, and will be available on our website in late May 2018.

In addition to full or partial assessments, each regulated profession must provide an annual Fair Registration Practices Report detailing the profession's progress in meeting the requirements of the fair access legislation. The College's submitted Reports are available <a href="here">here</a>.

#### Can I write a doctor's note or complete a form brought in by my patient?

There are two things to consider in this situation:

- 1. A Member may provide a note or complete a form if the recipient of the document accepts a naturopathic doctor as a health care provider authorized to provide the requested information. The Member should check with the patient to ensure that whoever is asking for the document has indicted that they recognize a naturopathic doctor as an acceptable provider. For example, if a form indicates that only a physician's signature is accepted, an ND is not a recognized provider in this case and completing this form could be considered professional misconduct.
- 2. A Member must:
  - a. only provide information that is within the scope of practice of the profession;
  - only communicate a naturopathic diagnosis that has been formulated following a naturopathic assessment;
  - c. only include information that is within their individual knowledge, skill and judgment; and
  - d. ensure they have the consent of the patient to release any detailed information.
