Personal beliefs in naturopathic practice

Personal beliefs and cultural practices are important components in the lives of naturopathic doctors and their patients. In assessing a patient's conditions, Members often take religious, social and cultural factors into account, as well as their health history and symptoms.

The Code of Ethics states that naturopaths are required to practise in a manner that treats each patient with dignity and respect and to provide care that respects the patient's needs, values and

dignity, and does not discriminate on any grounds, including on the basis of race, ancestry, place of origin, colour, ethnic origin, citizenship, creed, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, age, marital status, family status or disability.

It is expected that any discussions during a patient visit are relevant to the patient's care and treatment. Sharing any personal views and values (including political, religious and moral beliefs) with patients may exploit their vulnerability or cause distress. In addition, Members must be very careful not to breach the professional boundaries that are essential to maintaining a relationship of trust between a naturopathic doctor and a patient, as well as recognizing the position of power the Member has over the patient within the therapeutic relationship.
