New Cannabis Regulations: What they mean for NDs and the public

The College is assessing what upcoming legal changes may mean for naturopathic practice in Ontario. We are interested in discovering how and/or if our Members would incorporate cannabis into their practices, i.e., administer, dispense, and sell it for medical purposes. We are also asking the public to provide their input. Ontario Prescribing and Therapeutics Exam

If you have been thinking of taking the exam in order to be able to prescribe drugs such as therapeutic doses of vitamins A and D, folic acid and more, consider <u>enrolling in the prerequisite online course</u> over the winter to prepare to sit the next exam in Spring/Summer 2019. Successful completion of the exam is also one of the prerequisites for meeting the *Standard of Practice for IVIT*.

Registration for the October 28, 2018 exam **is now open**. Registration will close on October 9th, 2018 at 5:00 pm or earlier, if maximum capacity is reached. To register, please click <u>here.</u> Eligibility has been extended to 4th year CNME-accredited program students, and NDs registered in another regulated Canadian jurisdiction, who have completed the Ontario Prescribing and Therapeutics course offered through the Therapeutics Education Collaboration (TEC).

I haven't had an inspection yet, do I have to have my Policies and Procedures Manual done or can I wait until I have the inspection?

Every premises performing IVIT procedures is required to <u>currently</u> have all the Inspection Program Requirements in place, regardless of whether or not they have had an inspection. This includes the Policies and Procedures Manual. It is expected that when the premises is notified

that it has been selected for an inspection, the Manual is complete and ready to be submitted as requested.

Preparing for registration renewal

If you recently changed your name...you can help speed up your 2019 registration renewal by submitting the College's <u>name change form</u> ahead of time. It is also your responsibility to ensure you keep your information current. This includes your email address, home address, practice location, and other details. This can be done through your profile after logging into your account through the <u>College</u>.

Remember that changing your name and/or your class of registration takes extra time and must be completed before you can start the renewal process. As a result, you must first submit the Change of Class of Registration form and, only after being notified by the College that your request has been completed, can you proceed to renew your registration (pay your fees and complete the Information Return) for the new class. Please allow yourself sufficient time to complete this process.
